**Facebook Groups:** Most TCF members are aware of our *Parents* closed Facebook group, which currently has over 1,000 members across the country sharing stories and offering support. **Sibling Peer Support:** In Canada, support groups for bereaved siblings are presently provided through established chapters in addition to the main parent circles. TCF Canada Board member Adam Farrell is investigating how we could provide stand-alone sibling support in addition to the *Siblings* closed Facebook group and monthly virtual sharing circle. **Facilitator Training:** Andy and Eileen Bond conducted the most recent training session on Saturday, February 19<sup>th</sup>, via Zoom. Eight experienced and fledgling facilitators attended, including two who are planning to start new chapters.
